Admission Application Terms and Conditions

\$40 Application Fee

THE APPLICATION MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN APPLICATION FEE. Should the application be withdrawn within three business days of submission, the fee will be refunded on request. In the event a student withdraws or is dismissed from school, any unpaid charges are due immediately. No student may register until any money owed for prior programs for which the student was enrolled have been paid in full. No student shall be awarded grades, receive credit, be awarded a degree or diploma or have transcripts transmitted outside the college if any charges remain unpaid. Unpaid balances will be subject to late payment fees and may be placed with outside collections agencies.

Payment Information

Student account statements are mailed mid-July for the fall semester and are due by August 17, 2007. Spring semester statements are mailed mid-December and are due January 18, 2008. It is the student's responsibility to ensure payments are made by the payment due date on each statement. Payments received after the due date will result in late charges. If the student is unable to pay their student account in full or pay the difference not covered by financial aid, consider enrolling in a payment plan. Payment Plan information is located at www.lesley.edu/studentaccounts. Students must be enrolled in a payment plan prior to the due date indicated above for each semester. The student is responsible for updating their billing address, phone number and email address with the Registrars Office.

Lesley University accepts checks, American Express, Discover, MasterCard, and Visa. Checks are payable to Lesley University. The student's full name, student account number or Social Security Number should appear on the check to ensure proper application to the student account. Any check drawn on a foreign bank may incur collection and/or bank fees for which the student is responsible.

Students who have not met their financial obligations to the University will not be allowed to register for additional courses until the balance is paid in full. Grades, transcripts and diplomas will be withheld from students whose accounts show overdue balances. Students experiencing financial difficulties should contact Student Financial Services as soon as possible to review the payment options available. If the unpaid balance is turned over to a collection agency, the student will be required to pay all reasonable collections costs incurred while trying to collect the balance owed, including reasonable attorney's fees to the extent permitted by law. Pending financial aid amounts shown on the student account statement are anticipated funds not actual credits. Further action may be required on the student's part for these anticipated funds to be disbursed onto the student account.

Pending awarded financial aid is deducted from the balance on the first bill each semester. Please note that loan amounts may be a percentage less than the pending award amount noted on the student account statement. It is the responsibility of the student to check with Student Financial Services to ensure signatures or missing documentation is complete regarding loans and other types of aid for disbursement to the student account. While Student Financial Services staff are happy to assist students with determining tuition balances and arranging payment plans, it is the student's responsibility to make sure their balance is paid in full by the determined due dates.

Confidentiality

Student Accounts communicates with you, the student. If you want or need members of Student Accounts to speak with your parent(s), grandparent(s), guardian(s), aunt, uncle, or others, this information must be communicated to our office in writing. We do not provide student account information to people not granted this permission.

Tuition & Residence Housing Deposits

Accepted applicants confirm their intent to enroll by submitting a \$325 tuition deposit that is non-refundable after May 1, 2007 and is credited to first semester charges. If the May 1st deadline has passed, you may defer your enrollment to another semester and apply your tuition deposit when you subsequently enroll. The residence housing deposit of \$300 is non-refundable.

Deferment Policy

Only applicants who have been officially accepted to the college, and have paid the \$325 tuition deposit may defer for up to one year. Deferment must be requested in writing. The tuition deposit will then be credited to the semester for which the deferment request was made. The request must clearly state the semester to which you are deferring. Deferral is limited to within one academic year of the originally intended semester of enrollment. Only one deferment request will be honored; if that semester becomes unfeasible, the student must then reapply.

Tuition Refund Plan

This plan dramatically enhances the University's refund schedule and provides more generous refunds throughout the entire term. The plan will:

- Return your tuition and allow you to re-enter college when a term must be repeated.
- Provide funds which can reduce your loan obligations under programs such as Stafford.
- Refund 100 percent of your insured term tuition and fees if you withdraw from classes because of a personal illness or accident.
- Refund 60 percent of your insured term tuition and fees if the withdrawal results from a mental/nervous disorder.
- We recommend the Tuition Insurance Plan to every student for whom the loss of a term's fee would represent a significant financial hardship.
